RULES:

1. Potted plants must be owned by the exhibitor at least 60 days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
2. Potted plants should be suitably groomed for exhibit and where appropriate, leaves may be moderately polished.
3. Any plant may be in hanging basket or potted, unless noted.
4. Liner is 4 inches or smaller and one gallon is 6 inches pot, #1 can or tree pot.

Note: The exhibitor as an integral part of their Supervised Agriculture Experience program must have grown exhibits in the Floriculture Department.

AWARDS:

Sweepstakes (individual) - Grand Champion Plant Divisions 17 - 21

Best Exhibit - Grand Champion Floral, Divisions 18 - 21 Best Chapter Exhibit - \$1 of Premium = 1 point from Divisions 17 - 21 for each member exhibiting; plus 400 points based on judges scores for Division 22.

Exhibit construction begins August 13. Entries must be in place by 7 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 17.
American System of Judging

RULES:

1. The Show Superintendent reserves the right to accept or reject entry closing date, if capacity has been reached.
2. *If Chapter is willing to do a second display it should indicate on entry form. If division is not filled by entry closing date, these organizations will be notified that they may make a second entry. It is recommended that a second choice of theme be listed on your entry form.
3. Area provided will be 192 square feet. Location of space will be assigned by the show superintendent in the order in which entry forms are received.
4. Sod ground covering must not exceed 40% of the total square feet in the display.
5. No part of an exhibit may be removed by the exhibitor during the show except with permission of the Superintendent.
6. A 12x16 plot plan will be required at the time of installation. The plan will show location and names of plants. A new as built plan can be presented at the time of judging, but first plan must be available at time of judging. Signature and labeling must not detract from the design of the booth.

7. Each display must be designed, constructed and installed by members under direct supervision of instructor. Instructor must be present at installation, but may advise only and not participate in construction. Care must be taken not to obstruct or obscure other displays.
8. Use of artificial foliage or flowers is prohibited.
9. Fountains and pools must be constructed of rigid or formed plastic or approved pond liners. Polyethylene alone will not be permitted.
10. Any water feature that leaks will be drained.
11. Exhibitor is responsible for all maintenance of the display. Premium money will be withheld or refused on any exhibit not properly maintained, or for any infraction of the above rules.
12. Management reserves the right to reject an exhibit for cause or remove any exhibit becoming unsightly.
13. All booths will be judged against a common theme. The 2010 theme is Xeriscape. All landscapes must use some plant materials that can be used in home flower arranging. No vegetable gardens. Plants must be used as an integral part of the landscape.
14. Presentation: Each chapter will have 1 member available at judging to present their landscape to the judges. Presenter must be in official FFA uniform.
