American System of Judging

**\*A Limit of 5 changes will be allowed on day of take in.**

For guidance of the exhibitor, the following Guidelines are factors which the judges usually consider in placing awards:

1. Condition of product, free from insects, injury, blemishes, disease
2. Quality of the product - firm, tender, crisp, fresh
3. Form - typical of variety, uniform
4. Size - desired by commercial use
5. Husband and wife are considered 1 exhibitor (see State Rules)
6. The Fair will provide plates for fruit and vegetables displays
7. **Judge have the discretion to change, disqualify, or move any item. (Cal. St. III. 4 a.)**

ALL FARM & GARDEN EXHIBITS MUST BE GROWN IN THE ANTELOPE VALLEY BY THE EXHIBITOR. **EXHIBITORS MUST REPLACE PERISHABLES WITH FRESH FRUIT & VEGETABLES ON WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 24, 2010 BETWEEN 8 -11 a.m.**
