MGR rules to govern and take precedence over all others for the MGR sanctioned shows

1. Goats must be registered by the Myotonic Goat Registry. The original registration certificate must accompany the animal during check-in. Kids under (3) months of age must be registered for any sanctioned classes. All goats must have a permanent ID that matches the Registration papers.
2. No percentage goats will be allowed to be shown.
3. All animals must meet health regulations as specified in the Rules for Exhibition as required by the California Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services.
4. Goats must be free of clinical symptoms of caseous lymphadenitis. Animals showing clinical symptoms of this disease will not be allowed to enter the area of activity or associate with animals entered by other participants. To define CL: enlargement of lymph nodes, whether draining or not. Evidence of incised lymph nodes will be prima facie evidence of caseous lymphadenitis in the animal under scrutiny.
5. Goats must be free of symptoms of all other contagious and infectious disease, whether or not such diseases are herein named specifically.
6. The show director has the final decision on whether animals satisfy all health requirements. By application for admission, each exhibitor agrees to show his/her animals by these rules. Presenting obviously unhealthy animals may, subject to the ruling of the show director, result in the entire herd's disqualification from the show.
7. All goats upon arrival may be examined by show personal before being penned. Goats showing evidence of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, abscesses, fungus will not be allowed to enter the barn or show.
8. All goats from out of state require official individual identification valid for 30 days after inspection of the animals, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit within 15 days of entering California. You **must** bring an extra copy of your goat's health certificate that will be retained by the show committee.
9. If you use microchips for identification, you must furnish a reader. Tattoos must be legible. Scrapie tags are acceptable.
10. All goats must be shown with collar or halter. Bucks must be secure at all times.
11. Show director reserves the right to split larger classes.
12. Private treaty sales will be allowed after the show. All private treaty goats must be entered in the show.
13. Entry Fee: \$10 per doe and \$5.00 per wether, no fee for the Junior Handler Classes.
14. This is an award, ribbon, and points show. Any available awards will be announced at the show.
15. All goats brought into the facility must be entered in the show with the exception of nursing does and kids.
16. Substitutions will be allowed at Check-In within the same class at no additional charge.

17. Any item that comes up that is not specifically covered by these rules will be decided by the show committee and their decision will be final.
18. The organizers of this show and facility will not be liable for any loss, damages or accidents to animals, persons or property while participating in the show. Youth exhibitors are to be accompanied by a responsible adult.
19. Substitutions can only be made within a division. Substitutions must be made when registration certificates are checked. There will be no refunds.
20. Exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the fair, Show Management from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is in any way connected with participation in the event, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Show. The Show Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the show. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the show. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.
21. The judge has the authority to:
 - a. Disqualify or transfer to the correct class any goat that does not meet the requirements of the division or class in which it is entered;
 - b. Disqualify any goat not properly cleaned or fitted;
 - c. Disqualify any goat that is in his/her opinion hazardous to public safety;
 - d. Examine the goats before entering the show ring; and/or
 - e. Refuse to make award to any goat that shows visible evidence of disease, deformity, or lameness. No award will be made to exhibits eliminated under any of the above instances.
22. No goats will be allowed on show grounds that are within 10 days pre-parturition, or with vaginal discharge due to recent kidding.
23. The judge shall award first, second, third place, etc. according to merit. If without merit, the judge shall make no award under any circumstances. The judge may award championships or other awards at his/her discretion for superior exhibits. This applies whether there are one or more exhibits in class.
24. Any inhumane or other inappropriate action to animals by the exhibitor may cause disqualification, forfeiture of awards, and removal of the exhibit or exhibitor from the show grounds.

Division 1 - Junior Handler Class (not MGR sanctioned)

Classes:

1. JH Junior Handler: Handlers aged 5 to 17 years of age

Jr. Handlers will be judged on showmanship. The goat will not be judged. Jr. Handlers may show a doe or wether of any age. This class is unsanctioned and the winners are not eligible for championship awards.

Division 2 - MGR Junior Wether

Classes:

2. Kids: 6 months of age and under
3. Jr. Yearlings: Over 6 months and under 12 months of age

MGR Junior Champion & Reserve Junior Champion Wether

Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 2-3. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

Division 3 - MGR Senior Wether

Classes:

4. Sr. Yearling: 12 months to under 24 months of age
5. Senior Wether: 24 months of age and over

MGR Senior Champion & Reserve Senior Champion Wether

Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 4-5. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

MGR Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Wether

Grand Champion will be selected from the junior and senior Champion Wethers. Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the remaining Champions and the Reserve Champion animal from which the Grand Champion was selected.

Division 4 - MGR Junior Doe

Classes:

6. Doe Kid: under 3 months of age
7. Intermediate Doe Kid: 3 to under 6 months of age
8. Sr. Doe Kid: 6 to under 9 months of age
9. Advanced Doe Kid: 9 to under 12 months of age
10. Yearling Doe: Unfreshened - 12 to under 24 months of age

MGR Junior Champion & Reserve Junior Champion Doe

Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 6-10. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

Division 5 - MGR Senior Doe

Classes:

11. Yearling Doe Sr.: Freshened 12 to under 24 months of age
12. Two Year Old Doe: 24 to under 36 months of age
13. Three Year Old: 36 to under 48 months of age
14. Four Year Old and Older: 48 months and over

MGR Senior Champion & Reserve Senior Champion Doe

Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 11-14. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

MGR Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Doe

Grand Champion will be selected from the junior and senior Champion does. Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the remaining Champions and the Reserve Champion animal from which the Grand Champion was selected.

Division 6 - MGR Junior Buck

Classes:

15. Jr. Bucks: under 3 months of age
16. Jr. Bucks: 3 to under 6 months of age
17. Jr. Bucks: 6 to under 9 months of age
18. Jr. Bucks: 9 to under 12 months of age

MGR Junior Champion & Reserve Junior Champion Buck

Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 15-18. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

Division 7 - MGR Senior Buck

Classes:

19. Yearling Buck: 12 to under 24 months of age
20. Sr. Buck: 24 to under 36 months of age
21. Sr. Buck: 36 to under 48 months of age
22. Sr. Buck: 48 months and over

MGR Senior Champion & Reserve Senior Champion Buck Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners of classes 19-22. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the animal standing 2nd in the class from which the Champion was selected.

MGR Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Buck

Grand Champion will be selected from the junior and senior Champion bucks. Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the remaining Champions and the Reserve Champion animal from which the Grand Champion was.
