## **Special Rules:**

1. Bring your ALSA membership card. ALSA show rules apply.
2. All exhibitors must pay an ALSA fee of \$5.00 per animal entered. Adult Non-ALSA members must pay a \$30.00 fee per farm for showing their animals in ALSA shows. Youth Non-ALSA members must pay a \$15.00 fee to show in ALSA shows. ALSA fees are due at check-in and will be collected by ALSA/LASC member.
3. Due to limited pen space, exhibitors may be asked to provide their own pens. If there is to be a cancellation, please notify the office at least one week prior to the show.
4. Pen sizes are 8' x 8', animals will be penned accordingly. Educational displays are encouraged.
5. Exhibitors must be at least eight years of age.
6. Please bring the original ILR certificates to be presented at check-in. All Llamas MUST have ILR certificates with the exception of animals shown only in Youth, Performance or Non-Breeding classes.
7. Llamas may be shown in Youth or Adult Performance classes but not both.
8. Health Certificates are required for all out of state Llamas.

## **Halter Rules:**

1. All Llamas shall be presented for judging with a halter and a lead rope and no additional decorations.
2. Halters shall not have tassels, pompoms or other removable decorations.
3. Nursing mothers may not be accompanied in the ring by their babies. We recommend not showing nursing mothers.
4. Unruly animals may be dismissed from the ring by the ring steward or the judge.
5. No ranch, personal or llamas names shall be displayed on the exhibitor or the animal while in the ring.
6. All animals must be shown in the correct age (as per first day of fair) and sex classification.
7. Llamas may be entered in only one halter wool class.
8. Classes may be combined or divided depending on the size.
9. Exhibitors ages 8 and over may show llamas. It is recommended that youth 8-12 not show intact males over 24 months of age. The judge has the option to dismiss an exhibitor with an unruly animal. Dismissal can take place even before the animal gets in the ring if the matter is brought to the judges attention by show management, gate personnel, or the ring steward.
10. Exhibitors are responsible for being at ring side ten min. before the scheduled time of their class.
11. Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's discretion.

## **DIVISION 1**

SURI WOOL – Fiber characterized by absence of crimp and minimal loft with distinctive and defined lock structure.

## **DIVISION 3**

MEDIUM WOOL

Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool

## **DIVISION 2**

LIGHT WOOL – Minimal body wool, short neck wool, with smooth legs

## **DIVISION 4**

HEAVY WOOL

Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool, leg wool at least to knee and hock.

## **DIVISION 5**

NON-BREEDING LLAMAS

Requirements:

1. These classes are for geldings, vasectomized males and spayed or non-reproductive females that are suitable for other purposes.
2. These llamas must be accompanied by a registration or veterinarian certificate verifying the above condition.
3. There are no sex or wool divisions in this division.
4. Llamas may be combined at the show if there are fewer than three llamas in a class.

1. Yearling, 13 through 24 months
2. 2 Year Old, 25 to 36 months
3. Adults, 37 months and over

## **DIVISION 6**

GROUPS

### **CLASS:**

1. Get of Sire: Each entry must include only three offspring by the same sire. The Get must represent offspring by at least two dams. The Sire is entered in this class but will not be shown.
2. Produce of Dam: Each entry must include only two offspring by the same dam. The Produce may be represented by offspring of either sex. The Dam is entered in this class but will not show.

# PERFORMANCE

## Open and Junior Rules:

1. Classes are open to any age of Llama five (5) months of age and over except if otherwise specified in the class requirements. The judge shall make the final inspection of the course to ensure its safety. A diagram of all courses will be posted at least one hour before the scheduled show.
2. Only voice and hand commands may be used in exhibiting animals. The use of food, clickers, or any other device is strictly prohibited. No written notes may be used in performance classes.
3. A Llama may be entered in only one division of the respected class. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter
